Niobe is punished for her boasting.

ἡ δὲ Νιόβη θυγάτηρ ἦν τοῦ Ταντάλου. ὁ δὲ τῶν Θηβῶν βασιλεὺς ἔγημεν αὐτήν· ἡ δὲ Νιόβη ἔτεκεν ἑπτὰ υἱοὺς καὶ ἑπτὰ θυγατέρας. ἡ δὲ Λητώ θεὰ ἦν, καὶ μήτηρ θεῶν· ὁ γὰρ Ἀπόλλων υἱὸς αὐτῆς ἦν καὶ ἡ Ἄρτεμις θυγάτηρ. ἡ οὖν Λητώ πολλὴν τιμὴν ἔσχε καὶ αἱ ἐν ταῖς Θήβαις γυναῖκες αὐτήν ἐθεράπευον. ἀλλὰ ἡ Νιόβη εἶπε “διὰ τί τὴν θεὰν θεραπεύετε; ἡ μὲν Λητώ δύο παῖδας ἔχει, ἐγὼ δὲ τέσσαρας καὶ δέκα. ἐμὲ οὖν θεραπεύετε, ὦ γυναῖκες.” ἐπεὶ ἡ Λητώ ταῦτα ἤκουσε μεγίστη ὀργή αὐτὴν ἔλαβεν. ἐκέλευσεν οὖν τὴν μὲν Ἀρτέμιδα πάσας τὰς τῆς Νιόβης θυγατέρας καὶ τὸν δ’ Ἀπόλλωνα πάντας τοὺς αὐτῶν ἀδελφοὺς ἀποκτείνειν. ἔπειτα δὲ ὁ Ζεὺς τὴν Νιόβην αὐτὴν εἰς πέτραν μετέβαλεν.

Solon's trick helps the Athenians to recover Salamis from the Megarians.

 ἀνδρειότερος ἢ ἄλλοι ὄν, ἔπεισε τοὺς Ἀθηναίους αὖθις μάχεσθαι καὶ αὐτὸς 3
 στρατηγὸς ἐποιεῖτο ὑπὸ τῶν πολιτῶν. ὁ οὖν Σόλων ἐπλευσε πρὸς τὴν τῆς 4
Ἀττικῆς ἄκραν καὶ ἐκεῖ ἠῦρε γυναῖκας τινὰς θουόσας τοῖς θεοῖς. καὶ ἐπεὶ 5
 αὐτὰς εἶδεν ἔπεμψεν ἄγγελον εἰς τὴν Σαλαμίνα προσποιούμενον αὐτόμολον 6
 ἐκ τῶν Ἀθηναίων εἶναι. ὁ δ' ἄγγελος εἶπεν “στρατεύετε πρὸς τὴν ἄκραν, ὧ 7
 Μεγαρῆς. ἐνθάδε γὰρ τὰς τῶν Ἀθηναίων γυναῖκας εὐρήσετε. οὐ δὲ χαλεπὸν 8
 ἔσται αὐτὰς λαμβάνειν, ἀλλὰ χρήσιμον ὑμῖν ἔσται.” οἱ οὖν Μεγαρῆς ναῦν καὶ 9
 στρατιώτας εὐθὺς ἔπεμψαν. 10

 οἱ οὖν πολέμιοι, νομίζοντες αὐτοὺς γυναῖκας εἶναι, ἐξελθόντες ἐκ τῆς νεῶς 13
 αὐτοὺς ἐδίωκον. οἱ μὲντοι νεανῖαι τὰ ὅπλα ἔφηναν καὶ ὀλίγου χρόνου πάντες 14

- c) According to lines 3-4, what then happened to Solon? [2]
- d) Describe what happened when Solon sailed to the headland of Attica (lines 4-5). [4]
- e) Look at the noun ἄγγελον in line 6.
i) Give a Greek verb you know related to this noun, together with the meaning of the verb. [2]
ii) Using this information, suggest a meaning for ἄγγελος. [1]
- f) Translate from στρατεύετε πρὸς (line 7) to ὑμῖν ἔσται (line 9).
Write your translation on alternate lines. [8]
- g) According to lines 9-10, what did the people of Megara then do? [2]
- h) Describe Solon's plan in detail (lines 11-12). [5]
- i) According to line 13, why did the enemy disembark from their ship? [1]
- j) Explain why ὀλίγου χρόνου (line 14) is genitive. [1]
- k) Give an English word derived from χρόνου (line 14) and give a definition of your English word. [2]
- l) What did the Athenians then do (lines 15-16)? [2]
- m) From the passage, find and write down an example of:
i) a strong aorist
ii) a preposition which takes the accusative
iii) an infinitive
iv) a noun in the dative [4]
