After Aeneas and the Trojans arrive in Italy, Turnus, an Italian prince, and Latinus, the king of the Latins, disagree on how to respond.

Turnus erat dux Rutulorum, qui in Italia prope mare habitabant. hic vir erat fortis et validus sed etiam saevus feroxque. ubi Aeneas Troianique post iter longissimum ad Italiam advenerunt, Latinus, rex illius partis Italiae, felicissimus erat et Troianos velut socios novos accipere cupiebat. Turnus tamen contra Troianos bellum gerere constituit, quod duci Troianorum non credebat et quod Latinus filiam suam, Laviniam nomine, mulierem illi dare cupiebat; nam Turnus Laviniam amabat. itaque Latinus, quamquam iratissimus erat, nihil facere poterat. “cur,” rogavit, “bellum pro pace facere cupis, Turne? nonne hi Troiani nobis auxilium, non periculum, ferunt?” Turnus autem, ubi magna voce risit et gladium regi ostendit, “hoc gladio hocque scuto,” inquit, “terram meam defendam et omnes hostes miseros occidam. nihil timeo, sed paratus sum pro patria et pro femina mea perire.”

Plutarch tells a few stories about the Battle of Actium (31BC)

Actium brought an end of the Civil War between Octavian and Antony, who was allied with the Egyptian queen, Cleopatra.

Marcus Antonius contra Octavianum in proelio navali pugnare nolebat. Cleopatra tamen eum coegit.

milites Antonii ei persuadere non poterant ut in terram copias duceret. 'cur,' rogabant, 'putidis trabibus navium credis, nec gladiis nostris? in terra contendere et vincere possumus! iube Aegyptios in mari pugnare, sed da nobis terram!' Antonius autem miserrimus nihil respondit.

die proelii omen Octaviano datum est: prima luce ad litus ibat, ut naves suas inspiceret, ubi virum cum asino ambulantiem conspexit. ille 'nomen meum', inquit, 'est Eutychnus. asinus meus Nikon vocatur.'
