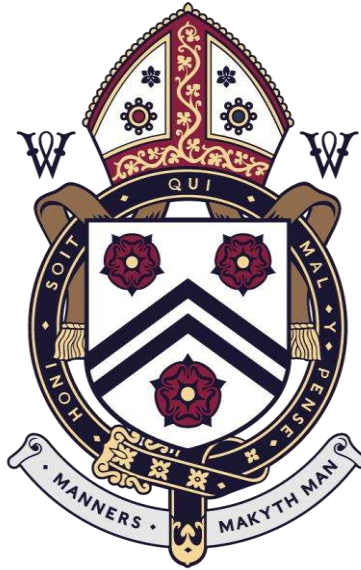

Read this passage carefully, and then, without writing a translation, answer the questions which follow.

The aristocrat Catiline plots revolution, but the consul Cicero stands in his way.

'cras', inquit, 'ad domum Ciceronis profecti, cum gladiis intrabitis in cubiculum eius et eum occidetis. nemo eum iuvare poterit.' unus tamen ex amicis, ceteris nesciis, totam rem Ciceroni narravit. itaque illi, cum prima luce ad Ciceronis domum advenissent, portam clausam esse invenerunt. itaque redire coacti sunt.

PROSE COMPOSITION

On **alternate lines** translate the following passage into Latin

Hercules is sent by king Eurystheus to kill the Nemean Lion

Hercules arrived at the city of Nemea and decided to seek the lion. 'Arrows are not able to kill it,' he said. 'Therefore I will take my club.'

Hercules set out to find the lion. He followed it into a cave which had two mouths. When he had blocked the first mouth, he approached the savage lion through the second. They fought for a long time, but at last, having been overcome by Hercules' huge arms, the lion died.

When Hercules returned to Mycenae, carrying the body of the lion, king Eurystheus was terrified. 'Surely that man has not killed the lion?' he asked. He did not want to greet Hercules; and so he hid himself in a big jar so that he would not be seen.
